Our dogs testimony is what sold our family on Shaklee. She continually was losing her red blood cells and I frequently had to take her in for transfusions and medication. Being 25-30lbs overweight, 11 years old with extreme arthritis in her hind legs (I had to carry her into the car etc) I considered having her put to sleep. The vet informed me she had liver failure, cataracts and you name it. Well I paid the bill vowing it would be my last. I brought her home and my sister proceeded to give her **Vita-Lea, Calcium Magnesium, B-Complex** and **Alfalfa** throughout the day.

Within 1 month she was a new dog, running and acting like a puppy, she went every morning to my mothers robe pocket for her daily supply of vitamins! She went on to live another 4 years without limping, seeing just fine, no liver failure and most importantly never another blood transfusion. My dog Sam was having a lot of trouble with his back leg. He would hobble on it from time to time, then I noticed that the hobbling would change back and forth between both of his back legs. After the examination, the Vet told me that Sam can be temporarily put on this medication and see if there is any improvement. He was to take this every night for 14 days. If the medication doesn't work, then we would need x-rays at \$75.00 per x-ray, then possibly surgery at \$750 or up.

The vet was assuming that Sam possibly ripped a ligament. He gave us the prescription and we went home. The prescription was called: Rimadyl (Carprofen) 25 mg. He also gave us a pamphlet to read about the medications which on the cover "Arthritis can affect dogs, If your dog had arthritis, would you know what to look for?" Well, I thought this was interesting. What did ripped ligaments have to do with arthritis? I gave Sam the medication with hardly any improvement at all.

We have always looked at the supplements for pets the same as we do for humans.

We have a 15 year old Toy Poodle; weight 10-11 lbs. He has never varied from that weight (he gets no food between meals.) We give him, daily, 1/2 **Vita-Lea with Iron.**, 1 **Vitamin E** tab.; 6 **Alfalfa**; 1 **Joint Health Complex**; 1 **Chewable Vitamin C**. We know dogs are supposed to make C, but years ago my

husband suggested we give him one, because he did not stop the constant coughing, with the supplements. The vet had told us he was born with an undersize trachea. My husband theorized, because of the undersized trachea, maybe he didn't make enough C. I tried giving him one and the coughing stopped!

I had a business builder a few years back who raised Samoyeds for show. She purchased a male who was verrrrrry stressed! Back to the Samoyed - she put him on all the above listed goodies, and was also amazed at the results she saw. Within a very short time he stopped chewing his feet and backside where he was bare. She also had a bitch with a new litter who was having problems with her legs. She couldn't put her front foot down. A few days of Shaklee - especially the Cal-Mag - made a big difference, so much so that when she forgot to give her the Calcium, she began limping again.

One of the things we discovered was that most of the dogs we looked after had chewing problems. Some was stress, some was allergies to the shampoo that had been used, and most could be cleared up by using **Lecithin** and **B Complex**.
